

TRI GOLF



TEAM INFORMATION

- Competition 1: Any pupil in KS2 can take part
- Competition 2: Any pupil in KS3 can take part
- There is no limit to the number of pupils a school can invite to take part in this competition, but there must be a minimum of 10 pupils per school.
- Please encourage children already in school to take part to ensure at least 10 children enter the competition. Each school can have an unlimited number of entries but the top 10 pupils' scores will be used to create a team score for their school. The local SGO will work out the top 10 scores from each school.
- If every school which enters the competition has less than 10 pupils taking part then the average score per school will be used to determine overall winners.

RULES

The Tri Golf competition involves 3 games that each pupil must set up and take part in. You will find instructions below on how to set up the games and videos to help as well.

SCORING

Everyone is encouraged to take part, but the top 10 scores from each school will be used as your school team score.

SCHOOL GAMES VALUES

School Games has 6 key values. For this competition the focus will be honesty as we are relying on you to be accurate with your results.



GAME 1: GOLF DOMINOES


Equipment:

- A golf club (putter) but if not you can use a cricket bat, tennis racket, umbrella or something similar.
- A golf ball or ball of similar size but no bigger than a tennis ball.
- 13 targets such as plastic milk bottles, twigs or juice cartons.

How To Play:

- Place a marker on the ground from where you will start from for each go.
- From your starting marker, take two big steps forward and place down your first target. Continue to set up the area as the diagram above with a total of 13 targets, but instead of a grip length use one big step.
- You will have a total of 13 putts for this competition.
- You have to hit as many of the targets as possible, but they have to be hit in order.
- When you hit the first one, you run out and bring the target back to your starting place before trying to hit the second target and so on.
- When you have had all 13 goes, count up how many targets you have hit and this will be your score.



GAME 2: FINDER'S KEEPERS



- A golf club (putter) but if not you can use a cricket bat, tennis racket, umbrella or something similar.
- A golf ball or ball of similar size but no bigger than a tennis ball.
- 12 targets such as milk bottles, twigs or juice cartons.

How To Play:

- Place a marker on the ground from where you will start from for each go.
- From your starting marker, take two big steps forward and place a row of 5 targets as the diagram here shows with a total of 12 targets.
- You will have a total of 12 hits (putts) for this competition.
- You have to hit as many of the targets as possible, but in any order.
- If you hit a target you run out and bring the target back to your starting place before having your next go.
- When you have had all 12 goes, count up how many targets you have hit and this will be your score.



GAME 3: TUNNEL BALL

Equipment:

- A golf club (putter) but if not you can use a cricket bat, tennis racket, umbrella or something similar.
- A golf ball or ball of similar size but no bigger than a tennis ball.
- 3 markers such as plastic milk bottles, twigs or juice cartons.
- 1 towel to create a target.

How To Play:

- Place a semi circular target on the ground (you can create this using a towel or something similar).
- Take two big steps back from the semi circular target and make a line on the ground for you to hit from. From here take another step back and make/ place another marker on the ground and then do the same for a third time.
- You now have 3 marks to choose where to start from, just as the diagram above shows. The aim is to put (hit) the ball so that it rolls into the target area and stays there.
- If you choose to hit from the nearest marker and the ball stays in the target, you will get 1 point. If you choose to hit the ball from the second marker, you will get 2 points and if you choose to hit the ball from the furthest marker, you get 5 points.
- You will have a total of 10 goes at this game so your total will be out of 50.



HOW TO ENTER

- Keep track of the scores that your child/pupil achieves in each challenge and once all 3 games have been completed, parents/guardians or teachers must then submit the score for their child/ pupil.
- Parents/Guardians- Please use the Google sheet link below to enter your child's score. If you do not see your school listed on the link you have clicked on then it means you have clicked on the wrong area.
- Teachers- (for any teachers in school with pupils) Please use the following Google form link to submit your pupils score.


